THE AWARD:

The Connecticut Corporators to the ESE, the Big E, award grants for special projects. Their AgriScience award for 2015 is a \$500 grant awarded to an elementary school teacher to fund a special project involving agriculture in any form as part of his or her class curriculum during the school year. Teachers are encouraged to consider how they might expand the learning experience to benefit students beyond their own classroom. This \$500 is payable in September to the school of the selected Grant Award winner.

The award winning teacher, one guest, school principal, and representative from CT Ag in the Classroom will be invited to attend the Governor's Reception in the Connecticut Building on CT Day at the Fair; where they will be recognized during the awards and scholarship portion of the reception.

The award also provides funds for transportation and entry fees for one school bus of students and chaperones to attend the Big E, where the winning teacher and students will receive their award during the seventeen day fair. The trip can be scheduled on a day convenient to the teacher and the school.

Working with the CT Corporators, members of CT Agriculture in the Classroom, will distribute the grant application forms, collect the submitted requests and screen applicants. They will recommend applicants to the Grant Committee of the CT Corporators, who will ultimately make the final selection.

ELIGIBILITY:

Any Connecticut elementary school teacher is eligible to apply for this grant. Schools in all countiesrural, suburban, and urban are encouraged to apply.


